GROWING UP DIGITAL FOR PARENTS & STU-**DENTS:** <u>Today</u>'s teens face a staggering selection of social media outlets that connects them closely to family, peers and people we don't know. We need to be informed and realistic to help them. But what does that look like? On Sunday, Nov. 24, St. Paul's is hosting a pair of workshops designed to help students navigate life in the digital age, while equipping parents to help their kids along the way.
