Our Ministries

Envelope Secretary

The envelope secretary is a key administrative person at St. Paul's. Important parts of this position include:

- 1) Distributing envelopes to new members
- 2) Ordering envelopes for the new year and letting people know to pickup from church in mid-December
- 3) Weekly recording of individual offering amounts from the identifiable envelopes received in offering plates (includes guest/visitor envelopes)
- 4) Monthly recording of pre-authorized donation amounts, other offerings received (memorial donations, etc.)
- 5) Totalling and balancing year-end givings of each individual/family and issuing tax receipts; communicates pickup from church by February of following year (2018 tax receipts are issued by February 2019)
- 6) Works closely with church secretary in ordering/distributing envelopes, maintaining current name/address database of people using envelopes (please notify church secretary and envelope secretary of any changes to name/address/contact details).

Envelopes are a great way for regular giving, keeping track of financial support / maintaining annual pledges, and will ensure that you receive an annual tax receipt for your financial support at St. Paul's.
