We're also in the process of putting together material so that our children can still have Sunday School while we're unable to meet physically together. Everyone will be contacted about this, once this is completed.

Our Prayer Group has suspended meeting together physically, but it is still fully operational—in fact, now more than ever, as we face the challenge of the COVID-19 pandemic together! Caring Contact Ministry: The present COVID-19 situation has heightened the need for the new Caring Contact Ministry to become operational. Calls, emails, and texts have already been made with 70 households, and this number will continue grow signifi-

cantly this week. Thank you to the 20 people who are Helpers in this Ministry! Helpers will keep in contact with up to ten households once a month.

We would love to have more Helpers, as we have 283 households on our Parish List! If you can help in this Ministry, please let Fergus know. Also, whether or not we're formally a Caring Contact Helper, all of us have a vital role to play in staying connected with one another in this time when we can't be together physically. Please take the time to call, email, or text those you know to make sure they're managing, and ask permission to share any pastoral needs with Fergus.

Thank you to the 4 households who have volunteered to pick up groceries or prescriptions for those who can't get out. If anyone else would like to join this Ministry, please contact the Office at 403-256-1428; office@stpaulscalgary.ca.

Following the Alberta Government's recommendation, the Office will be closed for at least this week upcoming. Phone messages and emails will continue to be checked and answered regularly.

Fergus is available for regular visits via phone or email. He will also continue to respond to all pastoral emergencies.
