### **Parish Events**

All in-person COVID restrictions have been removed. Masking is still strongly recommended by the Diocese and Parish Council, and physical distancing is still being maintained. Services continue to be live-streamed.

Walk on World Labyrinth Day, 7th May 2022. Free to register in this study. You will need to go to the this website https://www.legacylabyrinthproject.org/worldlabyrinth-day to do this. Lots of information is there. Including helpful videos. Registration closes 3rd Mav/22. There are 4 main categories to choose from. Those being: Human Rights, Social Justice, the Environment and Strengthening Relationships. There is a zoom meeting if you can on 30th April. Click here to register. This year they are studying the question:" What would happen if groups walked together in brain/heart coherence, with specific intentions for social change?" and "What could happen if they walked regularly with that same intention over a specific period of time?" Our response to God's goodness is, from grateful hearts, to seek to be faithful stewards of what we have received, by giving all that we are and all that we have - our time, talents, and treasures - to God. Throughout the year the Stewardship Coordinator helps us reflect and act on the different ways we can give ourselves to God (for example, in caring for God's creation). Diocesan Canon 13.63 states: "In each Parish there shall be an annual stewardship program to place before the Parishioners the ministry and financial obligations of the Parish in the ensuing financial year." We now have a year-round Stewardship campaign: . : January to March : Time and Talent:: April to June: Environment; and July to September: Bring it All Together.; October to December Treasure.
