# **Parish Events**

All in-person COVID restrictions have been removed. Masking is still strongly recommended by the Diocese and Parish Council, and physical distancing is still being maintained. Services continue to be live-streamed.

#### **Maintenance Coordinator**

This person oversees and coordinates the care of our 7 Sunmills Green S.E. building and grounds. This includes regular activities such as grass mowing, furnace cleaning, and light bulb changing; as well as repairs of anything that is broken, from toilets to furnaces. It is helpful for the Coordinator to be "handy," and

able to do one-person, simple maintenance tasks; and to be part of a team of Parishioners who address simple tasks requiring more than one person (e.g., mowing). The Coordinator does



not do most of the maintenance activities themselves (e.g., snow removal), but, by delegating to others, they do make sure that these activities are done. The Maintenance Coordinator also attends, or at least sends monthly reports

to, Parish Council, as the Parish Council Maintenance Contact.

#### **Christian Education**

Christian education is a lifelong activity for all of us as Jesus' disciples. It has been aptly described as loving God with our minds. At St. Paul's, we have education for young children, teens, and adults of every age, with opportunities such as Sunday School, multiple mid-week studies, Quiet Days, and movie nights.

#### **Coffee Time Ministry**

St Paul's Sunday coffee ministry is one branch of the Hospitality Ministries. It provides an opportunity for people to meet, greet, and get to know one another following the Sunday services. This ministry does not have a set list of volunteers but relies on people signing the coffee list for the Sunday(s) on which they wish to provide coffee. A team of two or three volunteers works best. The team comes a bit early for the service, puts on the coffee to brew, makes the juice, sets out the coffee cups, cream, sugar, and readies the snack to be set out after the service. Following communion you come out, make the tea, and finish setting everything out in the hall area. Following coffee time you clean up. The first Sunday of the month is a 'no snack' Sunday. (This is a good Sunday to choose when getting started) On other Sundays a snack is provided. Your team of volunteers can bring the snack or use snacks provided by others from the freezer or the cupboard. Never done this before?? There are experienced people who are willing to help you the first time or two. Phone Iona Shaw (403-873-1204) for more information and to set you up with an experienced helper to get started. This is an important ministry for fellowship, and also provides an opportunity for you to get to know people while working with them. Volunteer as often as once a month, or once or twice a year or..... It is up to you.
