Parish Events

There are no in-person COVID restrictions. However, masking is still strongly recommended by the Diocese and Parish Council, and physical distancing is still being maintained. If a person is wearing a mask, this means that they are concerned about a possible severe outcome from COVID for them or someone they care about. So please be sure to keep two metres' distance from them. Services continue to be live-streamed.

Sunday Services are posted live at 9:30 am on our main Facebook page. A Facebook account isn't needed to watch. You just go to the link https://www.facebook.com/ stpaulscalgary and click on the video. At around 11:30 am onward, if you don't have a Facebook account, you'll be able to watch the Service by going to our website (https:// www.stpaulscalgary.ca/podcasts/media) or YouTube Channel.

These take place on the 3rd Saturday of the month, at 8:30 and 11:30 am, respectively, with the next occurring on October 15. The Men's Breakfast is prepared by the men themselves, a couple each time, with a suggested donation of \$5 going to CAWST (the Centre for Affordable Water Sanitation Technology). Maintenance Coordinator

This person oversees and coordinates the care of our 7 Sunmills Green S.E. building and grounds. This includes regular activities such as grass mowing, furnace cleaning, and light bulb changing; as well as repairs of anything that is broken, from toilets to furnaces. It is helpful for the Coordinator to be "handy," and able to do one-person, simple maintenance tasks; and to be part of a team of Parishioners who address simple tasks requiring more than one person (e.g., mowing). The Coordinator does not do most of the maintenance activities themselves (e.g., snow removal), but, by delegating to others, they do make sure

that these activities are done. The Maintenance Coordinator also attends, or at least sends monthly reports to, Parish Council, as the Par-

Parish Council

Parish Council is the leadership team of the Parish, consisting of 10 to 15 members who represent the different ministries of our congregation. These individuals are elected to a two year term at our Annual Meeting of Parishioners. Their role is to see that the day to day operation and special events take place smoothly. Parish Council meetings are also a time to discuss any problems a ministry maybe having.

Parish Council meets on the second Tuesday of each month except for July and August when we meet just once.

Pastoral Care Team

Our Pastoral Care Team members are our clergy and lay members. We also have unofficial members who help out. The members of our team visit people at home, in the hospital or call on the phone.

Pastoral Care is really something we can all do. It is saying "Hi" with a smile, giving a hug, talking to someone who seems to be standing alone, or offering someone a ride. We never know what is going on in people's lives, and these small gestures make a difference.
