Parish Events



We welcome all members of our Armed Forces, past and present, who are sharing our worship today. Thank you for your service!

There are no in-person COVID restrictions. However, masking is still strongly recommended by the Diocese and Parish Council, and physical distancing is still being maintained. If a person is wearing a mask, this means that they are concerned about a possible severe outcome from COVID for them or someone they care about. So please be sure to keep 2 metres' distance from them. Services continue to be live-streamed.

Sunday Services are posted live at 9:30 am on our main Facebook page. A Facebook account isn't needed to watch. You just go to the link <https://www.facebook.com/stpaulscalgary> and click on the video. At around 11:30 am onward, if you don't have a Facebook account, you'll be able to watch the Service by going to our website (<https://www.stpaulscalgary.ca/podcasts/media>) or YouTube Channel. To ensure that everyone is able to share the whole Service online, as well as in-person, we'll be pausing the Liturgy, if any problem arises, to give us time to address the issue. If we're unable to continue live-streaming, we'll record the remainder of the Service, and post it as soon as possible on Sunday.

Sunday School: We are using the Virtual Church School curriculum offered by the Anglican Church of Canada. The link is on our website. For those joining us online, this is the same material we used while in-person Sunday School was on hiatus. For more information, see *Living Waters*.

Appeal for Donations for a Refugee Family

URGENT: The Diocesan Refugee Committee is seeking immediate help from parishes and parishioners in the Calgary area. An emergency situation has come to our attention. This involves a refugee family of 4 (Parents and 2 children) who are coming from a tent camp in Jordan and are set to arrive on 21 November 2022. We are in search of a 3 bedroom house, apartment or townhouse preferably in the southwest part of Calgary, as well as donated furniture (in good shape), 3 beds (1 double/queen and 2 singles), housewares, linens and other items to set up their living accommodation. We will also need a place to store the items until we have secured a residence. If, as an individual or as a parish, you are able to help with donations or a storage space, or if you know of a 3 bedroom accommodation, please contact: The Rev'd Canon Erin Phillips, Chair of the Diocesan Refugee Committee



Maintenance Coordinator

This person oversees and coordinates the care of our 7 Sunmills Green S.E. building and grounds. This includes regular activities such as grass mowing, furnace cleaning, and light bulb changing; as well as repairs of anything that is broken, from toilets to furnaces. It is helpful for the Coordinator to be "handy," and able to do one-person, simple maintenance tasks; and to be part of a team of Parishioners who address simple tasks requiring more than one person (e.g., mowing). The Coordinator does not do most of the maintenance activities themselves (e.g., snow removal), but, by delegating to others, they do make sure that these activities are done. The Maintenance Coordinator also attends, or at least sends monthly reports to, Parish Council, as the Parish Council Maintenance Contact.



Stewardship

All that we have is a gift from God. Our response to God's goodness is, from grateful hearts, to seek to be faithful

stewards of what we have received, by giving all that we are and all that we have - our time, talents, and treasures - to God. At St. Paul's we have on Parish Council the ministry of Stewardship Coordinator to help us do this. Throughout the year the Stewardship Coordinator helps us reflect and act on the different ways we can give ourselves to God (for example, in caring for God's creation). Diocesan Canon 13.63 states: "In each Parish there shall be an annual stewardship program to place before the Parishioners the ministry and financial obligations of the Parish in the ensuing financial year." We have a year-round Stewardship Program. If anyone is interested in being on the Stewardship committee please contact Laura Anne at the Parish Office.

Altar Guild

The Altar Guild teams prepare the Altar for regular weekly services as well as baptisms, weddings, funerals, and additional services connected to Lent, Holy Week, Easter, advent and Christmas. The teams prepare the communion vessels, flowers, candles, linens and lectionary books as a gift to God and to all who come to worship at St. Paul's.
