Parish Events

There are no in-person COVID restrictions. Masking, however, is strongly recommended by the Diocese and Parish Council, and physical distancing is still being maintained. If a person is wearing a mask, this means that they are concerned about a possible severe outcome from COVID for them or someone they care about. So please be sure to keep 2 metres' distance from them. Services continue to be live-streamed.

Sunday Services are posted live at 9:30 am on our main Facebook page. A Facebook account isn't needed to watch. You just go to the link <u>https://www.facebook.com/stpaulscalgary</u> and click on the video. At around 11:30 am onward, if you don't have a Facebook account, you'll be able to watch the Service by going to our website (https://www.stpaulscalgary.ca/podcasts/ media) or YouTube Channel. To ensure that all are able to share the whole Service online, we'll pause the Liturgy, if any problem arises, to give us time to address the issue.

Confirmation preparation is under way, using the new Alpha Youth Series on video. We're now showing and discussing this twice a month, in our Jr. High Sunday School class on 1st and 3rd Sundays.

Everyone's invited to our in-person Coffee Time after the Service. Thank you, Rick and Robbie, for looking after this today! We're looking for helpers in the Coffee Time Ministry. The Zoom link for it is in each Sunday's Order of Service.

Midweek online Service: We've posted on Facebook and YouTube an online Week of Prayer for Christian Unity Service, led by Fergus and Pastor Wallace of All Saints Lutheran. Here's a link: <u>https://youtu.be/CaG48cMfBLM</u>. As of Jan. 25, this Service had been shared by around 87 people. These Services are posted around the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of the month. The easiest way to view them on YouTube is to subscribe to our Channel (the link is in the right hand corner of the page). The next one is Feb 9.

Our in-person Wednesday Holy Eucharist and "Wednesdays with the Word" Bible Study occur on the odd Wednesdays of the month, at 9:30 and 10:30 am, respectively. *The next are THIS WEDNESDAY, Feb. 1.*

Wednesday Evening Christian Education Study: Part 2 of "Being Anglican." We're continuing our exploration of the 2021 and 2022 material from the worldwide Anglican Communion. From fall to spring, we're spending 18 sessions together to delve into the 3 parts of this material. In this second Part, we're sharing 5 Studies on Anglican Church Life, with a special focus on the Five Marks of Mission. We're meeting Wednesdays to Feb. 15 at 7:30 pm via Zoom. Please contact Fergus for the link. EVERYONE IS INVITED to join us in our Annual Meeting of Parishioners (AMP), which takes place TODAY at 11 am in the Parish Hall! Lunch is provided. To have a vote at the AMP, you'll be asked to sign a Declaration to satisfy Diocesan Canon 13.52, saying: "I solemnly declare that I am baptized and that I regularly attend Services of Worship in the Parish of St. Paul, Calgary and receive communion or otherwise receive the administrations of the Clergy of the Parish of St. Paul and that I have not voted at an annual meeting of the Parishioners of any other Parish this year, and that I am of the full age of 16 years." Those who sign this Declaration will be the attendees of record.

The AMP is being live-streamed to our "St. Paul's Anglican Church, Calgary" Facebook page. If you can't attend in-person, you're invited to share the Meeting in this way. If you're watching online you'll have the status of observers. You won't be officially recorded as AMP attendees, or have a vote or forum for live interaction. The AMP will also be posted later in the day on our Website and YouTube.

A temporary leader for POP is needed to support coleader Karen during Laura's absence March to mid-April. Detailed instructions and support are available. The commitment involves leading POP in 1 volunteer event in March and 2 short information meetings after Sunday Services, as well as monitoring/updating communication (email, Instagram, info. to go on website). A police check (paid for by the Parish) is required. It would also be ideal for the temporary leader to be a driver with access to a vehicle. It's a great opportunity for an adult >21 years! Parish Council Positions to be Filled

<u>Maintenance Coordinator</u> Church council is looking to fill the position of Maintenance Coordinator. The purpose of this position is to *coordinate* (not necessarily perform) the work needed to maintain the church building. Typical activities include:

- Maintain a list of maintenance work items and find volunteers and/or engage repair persons to do the work
- Attend the monthly council meeting (currently via Zoom) and report on the building maintenance status
- Organize the fall and spring clean-ups (i.e. pick a date, 'advertise' for volunteers and arrange for some pizza)

- Arrange for the blowing out the underground watering system in the fall
- Renew the snow removal contract
- Arrange for plumbers, locksmiths and other trades if required for repairs

There are a few congregational members who typically provide help for this position. However, a coordinator is required. Since this is a coordinating position, actual building maintenance experience is not a requirement.

New Members Coordinator

We are looking for someone to fill the position of New Members Coordinator.

The role of the New Members Ministry position on Parish Council is to formerly Welcome all new members to St. Paul's and provide them with support and information about St. Paul's and its many ministries. For more information please contact the Wardens or Fergus.



Deputy People's Warden

We are looking for a deputy People's Warden. This is a position which will prepare you to be the People's Warden next year. The term for this position is 1 year and then 2 years as the People's Warden. You will assist the People's Warden by being an avenue for members of the parish to bring concerns and also compliments.

We are looking for a youth member to represent the youth of our parish on Parish Council. The responsibility of this position would be to attend Parish Council meetings and to give a youth perspective.

<u>Stewardship Reflection: 4th Sunday in Ordinary</u> <u>Time</u>
