SOUND BOARD AND SCREENS MINISTRY

The screen ministry enhances the visual experience in worship through the use of the Sanctuary screens. The soundboard ministry supports the music and worship by ensuring appropriate volume levels and minimizing feedback and other disruptions. People working the soundboard need to arrive at least 20 minutes before the service to set up people with lapel and hand held mikes as necessary and to set the sound level for the pre-service music. Throughout the service, it is important to anticipate the need to turn mikes on and off and to adjust volumes. The board is labeled to make this job easier and first timers will work with veterans during the service to become familiar with the board's operation. This ministry is not only required for Sunday services but also for other services such as weddings and funerals and special events like the Christmas pageant. All Mothers and Children Count in Rwanda

Thanks to Partners In Health, a PWRDF partner in Rwanda, working with PWRDF's All Mothers and Children Count project, new materials and job aids have been distributed for healthcare workers to better support

patient education. Fifteen health providers working in maternity care services from the three district hospitals participated in a training session on comprehensive emergency obstetrics and neonatal care. The project has helped increase the capacities of healthcare workers and help reduce the maternal mortality rate and increase the number of births attended by a skilled birth attendant.
