# **LOOKING AHEAD TO PENTECOST**

As we begin the month of May, spring seems to have finally arrived. This is a time of rebirthing as the land awakes from its winter slumber, as migrating birds return, and as new life sprouts forth. On the last Sunday of May, we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost—the birthday of the Church. Pentecost too is all about rebirth and renewal, new life and new beginnings.

Pentecost is the day in which we celebrate the pouring out of the Spirit upon the first disciples of Jesus and how from that day the church began to reach out around the world, how they went from being timid and afraid in their testimony to Christ to being bold and courageous in their witness; how

they went from being inward looking to being outward looking, from seeking to save themselves to being ones who had a passion for showing others where healing is to be found; how they went from hiding in fear or trying not to be noticed to being heralds of truth and justice.

Something strange hap-

pened on the day of Pentecost - as the Spirit overcame the confusion that had been upon the face of the earth since the days when the Tower of Babel was destroyed, and made it possible for the disciples to communicate with every person regardless of differences of race, colour, language or gender.

Something strange and profound happened on the day of Pentecost – almost 2000 years ago, and that something profound is still occurring as the Spirit continues to be poured out upon those who believe in and follow Christ - bringing order out of chaos, understanding out of confusion, unity out of diversity, justice out of oppression.

Pentecost is also the day in which we give thanks to God for the many gifts with which we have been blessed. Paul reminds us in his first letter to the Corinthians that everyone who follows Christ is gifted, gifted by God, gifted in different ways and to different degrees, but that each gift and each person is important - none more or none less than another: that those who preach are not greater than those who listen and that those who wait on tables are no greater than those who gather to eat. Each one of us if we are being obedient to the call of God in our lives is gifted by God and each of those gifts is used God.

This is good news indeed. God has given us a diversity of gifts to be used here in our midst at St. Paul's and beyond this church - in the world to which we are sent as disciples of Christ. We do have old men who dream dreams and young men who see visions. We have daughters and son who are moved by the Spirit to build up the body by sharing their faith, their hope, their worship of God.



We have those with gifts of administration, of preaching, and of teaching, of music and of prayer. We have those with gifts of help and of service and those with the gifts of hearing and of counsel, of presence and encouragement.

In all that we celebrate at Pentecost the hand of God is evident and that hand

calls us to rejoice and take heart. We earnestly pray that we leave no gift, no person out, because we know that God has not left us so incomplete, that God treasures and gifts each person here.

The good news is that we are equipped by the Spirit; we are equipped to do what the Spirit calls the church to do, which is to witness to the love and purpose of God as revealed through Christ Jesus our Lord and the Law and the Prophets.

The Spirit makes us one. May the walls that divide us from one another be broken down in our common service and celebration. And may God's name be praised - now and forever. Amen





# **PWRDF**

# **PWRDF's Response to Humanitarian Crises**

Every year PWRDF responds to emergencies in Canada and around the world. Primarily, we allocate grants to appeals issued by the ACT Alliance, of which we are a member. ACT Alliance (Action by Churches Together) is an organization of 140 international Christian organizations working in areas of high need.

When disaster happens, ACT is able to contact one of its members already in place and quickly get them funds for immediate necessities of life, such as water, sanitation, food and shelter. PWRDF also works with the Canadian Foodgrains Bank in this same capacity.

When disasters are particularly grave, the government of Canada sometimes introduces a matching period to encourage donors. The time period and the value of the match is up to the government. In April 2019, the government determined that only funds donated to the Humanitarian Coalition will be eligible to receive a government match.

The Humanitarian Coalition is a collection of 10 leading aid organizations providing Canadians with a simple and effective way to help during large-scale humanitarian emergencies. Its goal is to reduce unnecessary fundraising competition, increase the impact of humanitarian responses and reduce

administrative costs. The Canadian Foodgrains Bank is a member of the Humanitarian Coalition, and PWRDF's membership in the Foodgrains Bank allows donations to PWRDF to be matched.





Have you heard? Inn from the Cold has launched our newest annual campaign, <u>A Village Can</u>. From May 1 to May 31, all donations to The Inn will be matched dollar for dollar.

Our new campaign aims to raise \$1 million to provide a safe space for families on the brink of homelessness. While this may seem like an auda-

cious goal, *A Village Can*, is inspired by the idea that when Calgarians come together, seemingly insurmountable challenges can be overcome — something we have witnessed firsthand.

Since the beginning of 2022, the need for Inn from the Cold's services has surged, with more families reaching out for help. In response, the organization saw an outpouring of community support as Calgarians rose to the occasion of helping families get back on their feet. With more and more families reaching a point of crisis, your support is needed.

A Village Can, is a vital opportunity for the community to make a real difference in the fight against homelessness. # The Church's Call to Environmental Stewardship

February 13, 2011 By the Rev. Dr. Gilson A. C. Waldkoening

What does the gospel and the ministry of the church offer to a world concerned about its natural environment?

Many people throughout the church – farmers, business people, parents, pastors, workers of all sorts – are concerned about ecological issues. The health and well-being of our planet affects everyone. What does the gospel of Jesus Christ, and the ministry of his church, have to offer a world concerned about its natural environment? This article shows the biblical and theological basis for ecological stewardship.

Why not involve your congregation in caring for the earth? You may hear the gospel in a fresh way in relationship to God's abiding care for his whole creation.

God is active in the world! Although we often overlook the fact, each and every moment of each and every day is pre-

cisely the time and place that God Almighty is present. God constantly engages our lives, and the life of all creation. The Good News of Jesus Christ is that God has acted decisively for the salvation of all: Christ obediently suffered for us, and then God raised him triumphantly! God's continued activity in, with and for the sake of the world is consistent with that decisive act of salvation in Jesus Christ.

#### **God Loves the World**

God loves the world! Even while God pursues his wonderful mission among hu-

mankind, God's presence and activity affect the entire world. God created the world, according to the scriptures. That creation was not a one-time, over-and-gone event. God's creation of the world continues each day. Martin Luther so often taught this, and he encouraged us to live lives of creative responsibility that would be in harmony with God's continual care of his creation.

The Holy Scriptures testify to God's creative and redemptive work in all things. For example, Paul taught the Christians in Rome: the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; and not only creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved (Romans 8:21-24a).

All people have a renewed call to the role of steward or caretaker of creation Paul's faith in Christ was a mighty faith; his sense of the power of God's work in Christ knew no bounds. Paul saw that the work of God in Christ would complete God's work of creation, that redemption would be the most creative act of all.

If Paul is correct in his vision of the implications of Christ's work (and we believe he is!), then Christians and all people have a renewed call and renewed motivation in the role of "steward" or caretaker of creation. This role was given to humankind when "the Lord God took the man (Adam) and put him in the garden of Eden to till and keep it." Work and service in the world are not punishment for humankind. God gave work to Adam as a gift in the Garden before Adam fell

into sin. It was later that "toil" was added to work, and a "curse" was extended toward the earth because of human rebellion against God. When Christ comes and saves, humans are restored to their rightful and joyful role of stewards, tillers and keepers, and released from the burden of toil in their work.

When people do the work that God has given them, they join God in his mission to care for the whole world. Meanwhile, Christ draws all believers into the fellowship of the church, and it is through that community, too, that Christians are empowered by God to join him in care for creation.

Another great community surrounds and often meets the church as it goes forth in its mission. All creation is called to be a community and is united under God's care, as Paul's

teaching indicated. Signs of the great community of creation appear around us, even though many signs of strife rend the intended community of creation. The leading sign of the community of all creation is the church itself, with Christ's reconciling work at its center. From that center flows God's care for both the natural world and humankind.

#### **Ecological Crisis**

In recent years most people have become more aware of the ecological crises, the dangers that threaten the health and stability of God's natural world. There is much debate over the extent of this danger, and over the degree to which we must respond

with remedial action. No matter what the extent of ecological crisis — or even if there were no crisis at all! — it is clear from the biblical witness that Christians and all people are called to be responsible stewards of the earth, as well as each other.

The biblical call to stewardship will lead us to foster quality of life. The quality of life that is measured only by material goods and economic factors is incomplete. Total quality of life must include the health and stability of the natural world, relative justice and peace for people, and the free and true worship of God Almighty. It is on this basis, on this biblical vision, that Christians are motivated to respond to ecological crises. It is on the basis of belief in the power of the gospel, and confidence in its ultimate triumph, that Christians dare to do as Christ did, to reach out in responsible love toward a world in need.

To have the opportunity "to till and keep" the earth is an arena in which we can proclaim anew the powerful redemption of God's work in Christ. To care for the earth, just as to care for one's neighbor, is an opportunity to witness to Christ and to practice the church's mission. When the church and Christians are reaching out in service, they are most alight with the radiance of God's powerful gospel. This is why your pastor might ask your congregation to care for creation by some specific ecological project. It is why a seminary should include in its education the church's vibrant opportunity to serve Christ by tending God's own creation.



# Why Is Reading the Bible So Important?

The best way to learn about the past is to read the eyewitness account of someone who was there. God gave us such a record of creation.

Many Christians begin each new year with a plan to read through the entire Bible over the course of that year. Some reach that goal, but most don't. Then there are others who don't even bother to read God's Word at all. Is this issue really a big deal? Why is it so important to read Scripture on a regular basis?

Knowing God

First and foremost, the Bible is essential for knowing God and His will for our lives. The book of Romans

tells us there are certain things we can know about God from general revelation. Without Scripture people can know about God's power and divine nature by examining creation (*Romans 1:20*). They also know God's law because it is written on their

hearts (Romans 2:14-15).

However, there is a vast difference between *knowing about* God and personally *knowing* God. Everyone knows about God, which is why you are without excuse if you reject Him, but only a fraction personally knows Him. The Bible is the foundational truth that teaches the history of the universe, the origin of sin, the reason

for death, morality, and so on. Apart from God's Word, mankind would never learn the all-important message of salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ.

**Knowing God's Will** 

The message of eternal salvation is a vital and dominant theme in Scripture, but the Bible reveals much more—including how God would have us live. Through the recorded examples of biblical figures we can learn what pleases God and what does not. His Word also gives direct instruction to believers on how we should act in every circumstance.

God's inspired and inerrant Word was given for many reasons: to teach us, rebuke us, correct us, and instruct us in righteousness; it was also given so that we may be complete and equipped for every good work (2 <u>Timothy 3:16–17</u>). By reading the Bible on a consistent basis, you can find direction for your life and learn how to best serve the Lord who gave His life for you.

Knowing God's Word

Reading through the entire Bible provides an opportunity to better understand Scripture's "big picture." At the same time, we must be careful not to read the Bible just for the sake of doing it.

READING THROUGH THE ENTIRE BIBLE PROVIDES AN OPPORTUNITY TO BETTER UNDERSTAND SCRIPTURE'S "BIG PICTURE."

How can we present ourselves approved before God? We need to diligently study His Word so that we acquire an accurate understanding of it and then faithfully act upon the truth (2 Timothy 2:15).

Studying the Bible requires careful and prayerful attention to the text and the correct application of <u>biblical</u> <u>principles of interpretation</u>. By studying God's Word, you can not only more fully enjoy the wisdom God gives, but also bless your family and friends by sharing the fruit of your labor.

Making God's Word your authority in every area is vital for defending against the many spiritual attacks facing Christians. "But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts, and always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear" (1 Peter 3:15).

We encourage you to read the whole Bible if you never have before. If you have already read through the Bible, then we would urge you to consider studying Scripture in more detail by concentrating on one passage per

day. Continue thinking about that passage throughout the day and try to think of ways to apply what you have learned.

Don't forget to spend time in prayer. Thank God for giving you eternal life and His Word. Ask Him to teach and guide you so that you will become even more faithful in following Him.

Commit to read and study God's Word regularly in order to better know God, His Son, and His will.
